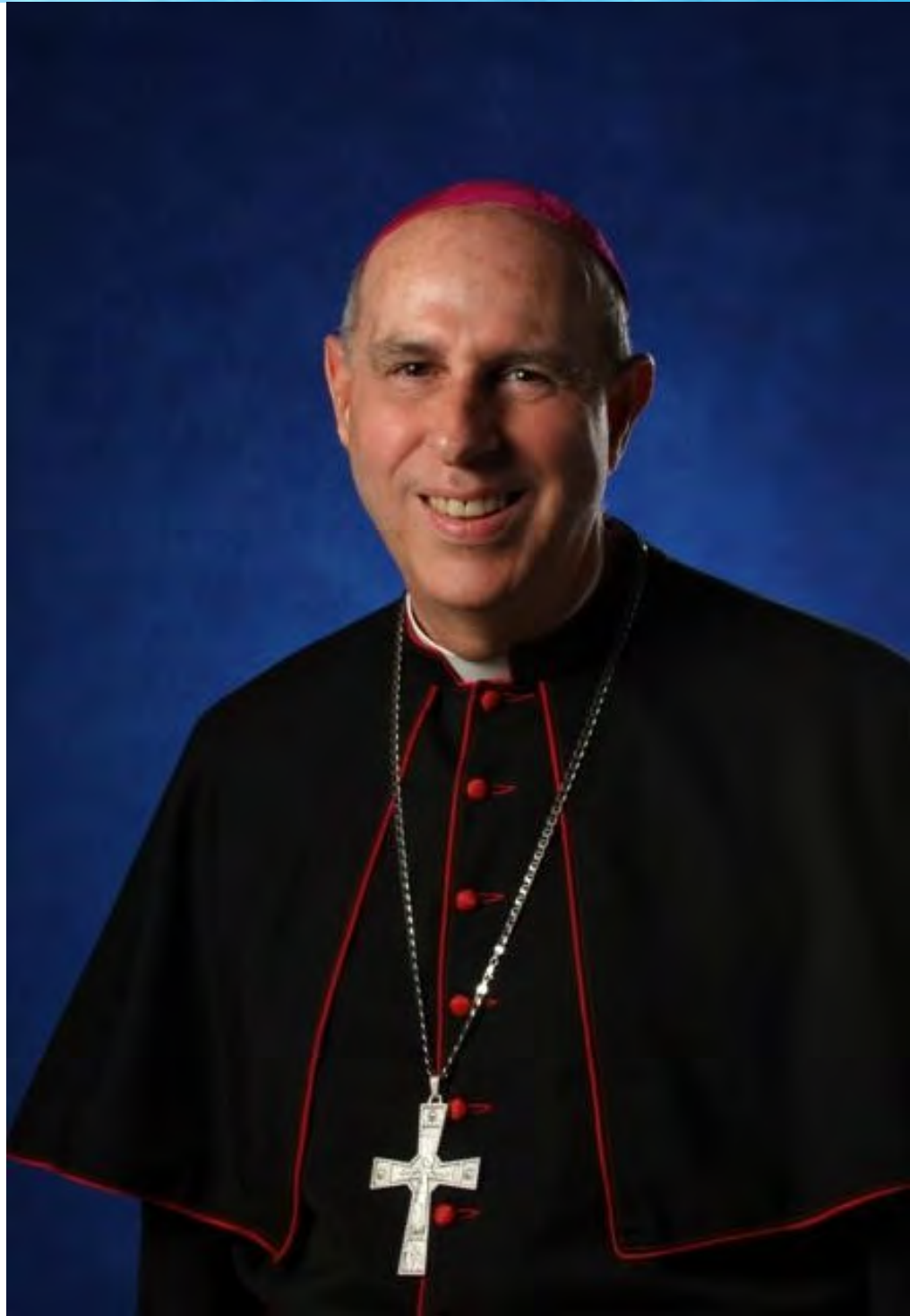

# WHAT TO EXPECT

## How do I register and then participate in the Virtual Conference November 12-14, 2020?

Go to [www.HopeHealRenew.org](http://www.HopeHealRenew.org) and complete an online registration form:

- A) Create your own unique user name and password – then finish the online registration form & submit.
- B) If you need to purchase more than 1 ticket for the event – you can do so on the form, but note each registration will need their own unique email in order to have access to the digital content for the event.
- C) To join the conference -go back to [www.HopeHealRenew.org](http://www.HopeHealRenew.org) and sign in with the User Name and Password that you created when you originally registered. The Dashboard is your home base.
- D) **NOTE: CHECK-IN on Wed Nov 11<sup>th</sup> from 1 pm – 8 pm PT or Thurs Nov 12<sup>th</sup> from 1 pm – 7 pm PT**  
Log on to the website and our volunteer staff will check you in and be sure you & your computer/tablet are ready to participate in the virtual conference experience. Think of this as picking up your name tag!
- E) Prior to the conference you will be asked by email, to pre-select the sessions you plan to attend during the event. This allows us to manage the needs for the meeting room sizes.
- F) For the best experience – join us on a computer or tablet. That will allow you to see the chat sessions.
- G) Read through the FAQ (frequently asked questions) found on the dashboard.

## How can you learn about the presenters?

The presenter pictures and bios can be found on the page titled: [Agenda – Presenters](#) under the Dashboard heading on the conference website. The session titles and descriptions are also on the same page.

## What's the Resource Center? And how does it work to visit one of the sponsors or exhibitors for the event?

The Resource Center can be accessed by visiting the [Resource Center](#) page under the Dashboard. You can visit it even before the conference, we will be adding more information as it arrives. The contact information for the Sponsors and Exhibitors are listed, along with links to their websites; event specials; schedule for live chats and other fun information. We will feature the *donated items* in the program book that will be available on Wednesday Nov 11<sup>th</sup> on the dashboard.

## How is this Virtual Conference Experience like an in-person conference?

This conference is more like an in-person event than you may realize. The content is the same as what you would have in-person – we are just delivering it differently to you this year. You move through the Schedule/Agenda just like you do at an in-person conference, but by moving your computer mouse – vs walking to a room. You can pick and choose which sessions you want to attend - assuming there is room left in the meeting room.

You will have the added advantage of being able to attend both live and pre-recorded sessions. The pre-recorded sessions are marked with a \* behind the session number. “ . . . I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God that you received through the laying on of my hands” (2 Timothy 1:6). Like Timothy, we catechists initially responded with fervor to the vocation of evangelization. We eagerly embraced the call to witness as priests, prophets, and kings. We made conscious efforts to function as the hands, feet, voice and compassion of Jesus. Today St. Paul encourages us to RENEW – to stir into flame our early enthusiasm.
